Millions. He has written several novels and collections of fiction. He lives in between Cairo and Berlin dedicating his full time for writing. In 2017 he was awarded the Egyptian literary award The Sawiris Prize. He was kidnapped by Sissi's regime in 2019 for political reasons and has been released after 8 days without facing any charges. Humphrey Davies is an award-winning translator of more than twenty works of modern Arabic literature, among them five of the novels of Elias Khoury. He has also edited and translated older works, including Ahmad Faris al-Shidyaq's seminal mid-nineteenth-century *Leg Over Leg* (Library of Arabic Literature, NYU Press, 2013-2014).

He lives in Cairo.

In the Eye of the Wild *New York Review of Books*

In the *Eye of the Wild* is a fascinating, mind-altering book about terror, pain, endurance, and self-transformation, comparable in its intensity of perception and originality of style

to J. A. Baker's classic *The Peregrine*. Here Nastassja Martin takes us to the farthest limits of human being.
