Dynamic causal models. The dynamic causal model is a multiple-input multiple-output (MIMO) system that comprises m inputs and l outputs with one output per region. The m inputs correspond to designed causes (e.g. boxcar or stick stimulus-functions). The inputs are exactly the same as those used to form design matrices in conventional analyses of fMRI and can be expanded in the usual way when necessary (e.g. using polynomials or temporal basis functions).

The name "Rubin causal model" was first coined by Paul W. Holland.
