Writing Learning Objectives with Bloom's Taxonomy Examples ...

Bloom's Taxonomy was created in 1956 under the leadership of educational psychologist Dr Benjamin Bloom in order to promote higher forms of thinking in education, such as analyzing and evaluating concepts, processes, procedures, and principles, rather than just remembering facts (rote

learning).

Bloom's Taxonomy of Learning Domains: The Cognitive Domain

This list is arranged according to Bloom's Taxonomy of Learning. Bloom's Taxonomy classifies thinking according to six cognitive levels of complexity: knowledge, comprehension, application, analysis, synthesis, and evaluation. The categories are ordered from simple to complex and from concrete to abstract.
