There are no scruples here. If you go along, you get tokens for the vending machines. If you don’t, punishment is brutal. As each new victim disappears to Back Half, Luke becomes more and more desperate to get out and get help. But no one has ever escaped from the Institute. As psychically terrifying as *Firestarter*, and with the spectacular kid power of *It*, The Institute is “first-rate entertainment that has something important to say.
